We're conducting a fully remote research study to better understand community mobility and physical activity in adults who are at least 6 months post-stroke. Participants will wear lightweight sensors including the Apple watch, carry a GPS device, and complete short questionnaires over a period of 2.5 weeks—all from the comfort of their home.

We're reaching out to physical therapists like you to help us connect with potential participants who may be interested in contributing to this important research. All procedures are conducted online, and participants will receive \$75 in compensation for their time.
